Envisioning Blockchain Technology at Region H

Thursday 23 November 2017, 09:00-13:00

Convergence of existing and future technologies is foreseen to disrupt the public healthcare sector in the coming years, but the real potential and concrete use of new technologies in the healthcare sector are hard to grasp by healthcare professionals, government officials and decision makers.

We invite you to take part in a workshop that will explore the applicability of blockchain technology in the healthcare sector and your own context. Together we will examine the potential of blockchain technology and look into how healthcare professionals can benefit from its application. We intend to facilitate a dialogue and a joint effort to identify potential use cases and blockchain solutions that can support the current and future needs of the healthcare sector.

The workshop is primarily for employees in the Capital Region of Denmark, but others are very welcome.

What is Blockchain?

Blockchain is one of the hottest and most intriguing technologies currently in the market and has the potential to truly disrupt multiple industries. The technology offers new innovative ways to manage work processes within and across organizations. With blockchain technology, we can record specific transactional data events that are meant to be shared across a network of stakeholders where transparency and collaboration are essential. Furthermore, the application of blockchain technology has the potential to vastly reduce the cost, complexity, and latency of cross-enterprise transaction processes, and is predicted to make these processes more efficient, secure, transparent, and democratic. More specifically, if blockchain lives up to its potential, it can provide an efficient information system secured by digital signatures, cryptographic hash functions infeasible to reverse engineer, and a decentralized consensus protocol through which stakeholders can securely collaborate.
